STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Math Science and Technology (MaST) Community Charter School recognizes that the involvement of parents/guardians and their support of student learning and achievement are important contributors in helping students succeed. Providing a quality education for all students attending MaST is at the forefront of all decision making and planning. MaST Community Charter School is committed to making a positive difference in the lives of its families and students recognizing the essential and important role of parents and the value of their input as partners in the education of their children.

TITLE I MISSION
