On Wednesday, April 1st at 6:30PM, Mary Ciammetti, the founder of *Don't Stall, Just Call*, will share her personal story of the dangers of binge drinking.

Mary Ciammetti discusses & teaches her audience to identify signs of alcohol poisoning and recognize the importance of calling for emergency help. Mary also highlights the physical effects of alcohol on the body, reviews local medical amnesty laws, addresses overall wellness and encourages students, teens, young adults and parents to change the culture of binge drinking that exists.

Talking with Teens: Drugs and Alcohol

- 1. **Ensure teens know what is expected at home & school:** No matter the age of students, school is a DRUG-FREE ZONE. It's important for your teens to know the consequences at both places if they decide to experiment.
- 2. **Praise/reward teens for positive decisions:** If your child tells you that they decided against peer pressure, tell them you are proud of him/her and why!
- 3. **Show interest in their daily lives:** Do you know who your child hangs out with at school?Do you know who they are snapchatting? Who do they sit with at lunch?
- 4. **Teach them the negative effects drugs/alcohol have on physical appearance:** Kids know that drugs are bad for them, but do they know why? How will it affect their futures?
- 5. Don't rely on schools to prevent drug use: We can't do our job without YOU!
- 6. Use detailed, realistic messages when talking about drugs/alcohol: Our kids know when we are being ourselves, especially high schoolers. Kids respect us more when we talk to them with respect. For example, use news reports as starters for drug-related conversations.
- 7. **Challenge them to be positive leaders:** We want our children to be positive role models, but that starts with us. Let's show them the importance of setting a good example!
